Dear Janet,

Thank you for your letter of 4 May, as Chair of the Petitions Committee, regarding Petition P-05-961 to lower the age for breast cancer screening in Wales from 50 to 30.

Wales, like the rest of the UK, follows the independent, expert advice of the UK National Screening Committee (UKNSC). Routine breast screening of women under 50 without any symptoms is not offered in the UK because the UKNSC advises that the current evidence indicates that the benefits of screening do not outweigh the known harms. At present, for breast cancer, the recommended routine screening age range is between 50 and 70 years, with screening offered on a three-yearly basis. All recommendations are subject to regular review and should the UKNSC recommend changing the age range for breast screening, the Welsh Government will consider how this can be delivered in Wales.
