### 1. Rhesymau

Pupils were told and continue to tell us, we closed the schools and gave them tools to work online. Many now do not feel the same 'pull' towards school now - being more comfortable at home or it has increased a reluctance to attend school. Many young people also say they have suffered increased mental health difficulties - the fear of covid, the pressure of exams and lost learning. For pupils with ALN, challenging backgrounds of poverty or abuse, this is more protracted.

### 2. Risgiau a chanlyniadau

Short term - lack of willingness to engage in a formal education setting. Young people report a lack of faith in the system - changing messages on wearing face coverings yet others work from home to stay safe. Concern for others who may be at risk of poor health, and the time spent away from direct support from friends and professionals.

Long term - lack of aspiration, increased reliance on IT and influencers online as opposed to professionals in person.

### 3. Effaith

Yes - many families took a decision to home school due to the concerns around covid-19, some with great success. Others have struggled and have reapplied for a school place.
