**The First Minister:** Responsibility for assessing care needs, and for planning and commissioning services to meet needs identified, rests with local authorities. This includes domiciliary care services provided in rural areas. It is the Welsh Government's responsibility to provide the strategic framework, statutory guidance and the regulatory regime to support those vital services.

Rydyn ni wedi amlinellu'n disgwyliadau ar gyfer lefelau staff nyrsio mewn wardiau aciwt, meddygol a llawfeddygol. Mae byrddau iechyd wedi datblygu cynlluniau i sicrhau y cânt eu cyflawni. Lle bo angen, rydyn ni'n sicr bod byrddau iechyd yn defnyddio staff banc neu staff asiantaeth.

**The First Minister:** The responsibility for ensuring safe, appropriate staffing levels lies with NHS organisations. We have set out our expectations for nurse staffing level in acute, medical and surgical wards. Health boards have developed plans to ensure these are met. Where needed, we are assured health boards utilise bank or agency staff.

**The First Minister:** The Wales procurement policy statement outlines the principles against which public procurement should be undertaken, providing Wales based suppliers every opportunity to win our contracts. A total of 52% of our expenditure now goes to Wales-based suppliers, compared with 35% in 2004.
