I would like to think that the Minister would take these statements and my petition on board and put forward (either in his and the Assembly Government's time or via a backbencher) whatever the term is given for a policy passed by the Assembly that is signed into law by Her Majesty (I regret that I do not know the term). Therefore, would it be possible to speak with the Minister (ideally in person when he next visits Ceredigion) and address these concerns with him?
