There are two of them: SL(5)048, the Seed Marketing (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2016, and SL(5)047, the National Health Service (Therapeutic Radiographer Independent Prescriber and Dietitian Supplementary Prescriber) (Miscellaneous Amendments) (Wales) Regulations 2016. Our expert team has cast an eye over this and there is nothing to report, they have clear reports, but do Members have any observations, or are we happy to note them?

So, unless there's anything in particular now, are you happy to note it? Thank you.

[14] Then we turn to paper no. 5, the correspondence from the First Minister to the UK Government regarding clause 60 of the Wales Bill, dated 22 September 2016. Again, we want to note this correspondence now, but of course we'll be returning to this during item 7, which is the update on the Wales Bill.
